- view the digitized minutes from the rural districts before 1970.

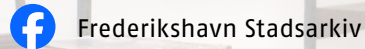

About the City Archives

Frederikshavn Municipality founded the City Archives of Frederikshavn on the 1st of June 2008 under Article 7 of the Danish Archives Act.

We work to preserve municipal records – both analog and digital – from the present-day Frederikshavn Municipality (after 2007), as well as the former Frederikshavn, Skagen and Sæby Municipalities (1970–2006), including the rural districts that ceased following the municipal reform of 1970.

The City Archives of Frederikshavn aims to:

- preserve significant records from Frederikshavn Municipality
- make records and finding aids accessible to citizens, authorities, and researchers
- advise users on the use of our records
- spread awareness of the history of our municipality.



Memory of the Municipality

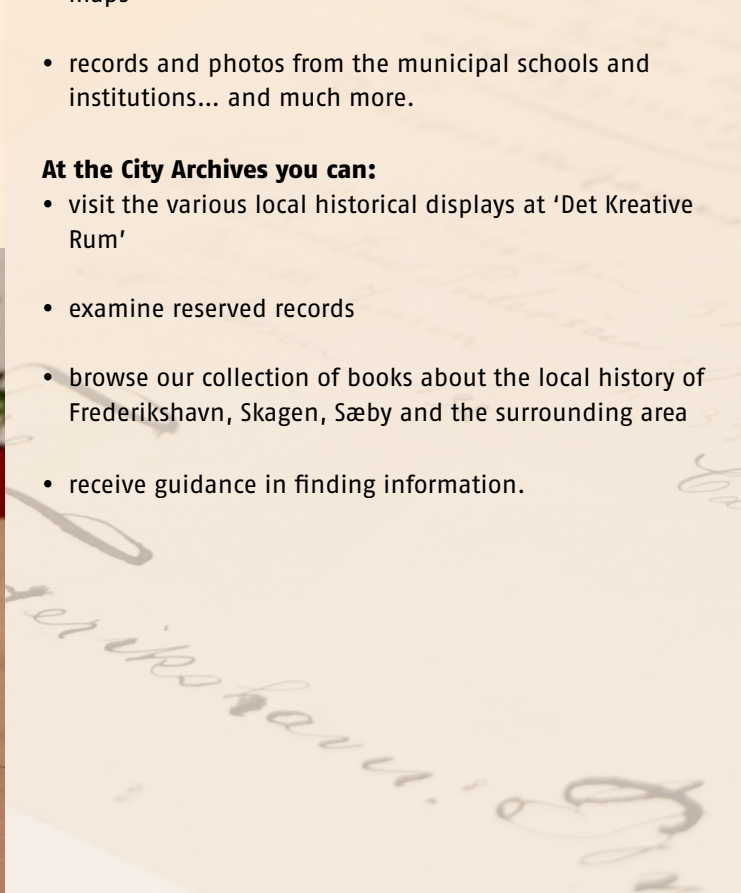
At the City Archives of Frederikshavn you will find much varied information, as the municipality is involved in most local affairs. The analog collections are kept in Frederikshavn City Hall and Sæby City Hall.

The collection contains:

- minutes from the city councils and the political committees
- records on administrative cases
- parish registers
- social records
- records on city planning, architectural drawings, and maps
- records and photos from the municipal schools and institutions... and much more.

At the City Archives you can:

- visit the various local historical displays at 'Det Kreative Rum'
- examine reserved records
- browse our collection of books about the local history of Frederikshavn, Skagen, Sæby and the surrounding area
- receive guidance in finding information.



Genealogy in the City Archives of Frederikshavn

There is a preliminary guide for genealogists on our website. It is a short English version of a guide, which is available from the City Archives of Frederikshavn (only in Danish). This minor guide is a brief introduction to genealogical research in the City Archives' collections and comprises the most important groups of records for genealogists.

In addition, this guide gives details of those statutes that assign release dates and access to public records.
